Dear Colleagues,

In connection with Alexey Chernavsky's 85th birthday (which was on January 17) we plan to hold an informal workshop in the framework of Moscow Geometric Topology Seminar.

The meeting is expected to take place at the Steklov Institute and via Zoom, tentatively on Wednesday, February 22. If it happens that Alexey Viktorovich needs to spend this day with doctors, then the date may be shifted (probably by one week).

You are cordially invited to participate in the meeting (either in person or online) and to present either a mathematical talk or historical recollections.

The meeting is open to everyone (except trolls), as are all meetings of the seminar, so please feel free to share the program and the abstracts (when they become available) and call other people to participate, either online or offline. Also please feel free to suggest additional speakers.

The choice of the language (English or Russian) is up to the speaker, but if the abstract is in English and there is at least one non-Russian-speaking participant (online or offline), then the talk must be in English. For offline participants there will be sandwiches, coffee/tea/chicory and eventually wine/etc. Videos of the talks will be available at the seminar webpage in a few days after the meeting.

If you plan to give a talk, please let me know by Saturday, February 18:

- 1) the desired duration of your talk (between 20 and 45 minutes for mathematical talks, between 5 and 30 minutes for historical recollections);
- 2) whether your talk can be scheduled for any time between 14:00 and 20:00 (Moscow time, which is GMT+3) on Wednesday, February 22, or only for some proper subset of these 6 hours;
- 3) if you plan to speak for 20 minutes or longer, then the title and abstract of your talk, or at least some rough idea about its subject.

Assuming that the date of the meeting does not change, the final deadline for abstracts is on Monday, February 20 (so that I can send out the announcement of all talks on Tuesday morning).

It is not clear yet if all requests on duration can be fulfilled (this depends on the number of people willing to speak). On February 3 we had another mini-workshop at our seminar, and in that case all six speakers spoke for as much time as they requested (or even a bit longer); the details can be found in the seminar webpage, https://www.mathnet.ru/php/conference.phtml?confid=192&option_lang=eng If there happens to be a shortage of time, preference will be given to talks that relate to the work of Alexey Chernavsky and/or include a discussion of his results, and also to original research.

If you would like to speak (also) in a regular meeting of the seminar, please let me know.
